The Fulbright Program



- Established 1946 to expand and strengthen the relationships between the people of the United States and citizens of the rest of the world
- Sponsored by U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs and administered by the Institute of International Education's Council for International Exchange of Scholars (CIES)




Core Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program

- Supports teaching and/or research for three to 12 months
- Programs active in +125 countries
- For faculty, administrators and professionals
- Open to all disciplines
- Apply to specific award with proposed project
- Application deadline: August 1
- Variety of host institutions









Eligibility for U.S. Scholar Programs

- U.S. citizenship
- Degree as required by award
 - > Ph.D. or other terminal degree may be required
 - Many awards are open to applicants with a Masters and professional or academic experience
- Open to professionals and artists outside academia with recognized standing and substantial accomplishments
- > Teaching experience as required by award
- New policies on previous Fulbright Scholar grants and waiting periods between grants

Multi-Country Opportunity

South and Central Asia Regional Research Program

- <u>9476-MC</u> Conduct research in any discipline
- Research projects may be of historical or contemporary focus, comparative or regional in scope or where data must be collected in two or three countries:
 - Bhutan, India, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan
- Three to nine months, letter of invitation required







Distinguished Chair Opportunity

India

- <u>9377-IN</u> Fulbright-Nehru Distinguished Chair (All Disciplines)
- Teach or teach + research (ratio determined by applicant) for four months
- A letter of invitation is optional, however, applicants are encouraged to identify potential host institutions







All Disciplines Awards

India

• <u>9379-IN</u> **Fulbright-Nehru Academic and Professional Excellence Awards** (45 grants for teaching, research or both; PhD not required; open to early career academics)

Kazakhstan

• <u>9380-KZ</u> Five or ten months

Kyrgyz Republic

• <u>9382-KG</u> Five or ten months

Maldives

• <u>9383-MV</u> Six months, starting in January 2020

Nepal

• <u>9384-NP</u> Research only (Grant length is six months, for Flex 4-5 months)







All Disciplines Awards - continued

Nepal

• <u>9385-NP</u> Teaching & Research (80:20 ratio)

Pakistan

• <u>9386-PK</u> Two-four months (Islamabad, Lahore and Faisalabad)

Sri Lanka

<u>9387-CE</u> Three to nine months

Uzbekistan

• <u>9390-UZ</u> Five or ten months







Multiple Disciplines Awards

Bhutan

• <u>9376-BT</u> One or two semesters (5 or 10 months)

Tajikistan

 <u>9388-TI</u> Letter of invitation preferred, host locations listed. Grant length: 4-9 months

Turkmenistan

 <u>9389-TX</u> Teaching grant, 10 years teaching experience or 5 years with PhD

- Emphasis on English language teacher training
- •PhD required, open to Early Career Applicants
- •Grant length: 5 or 10 months
- •Generous book and research allowance

Application Components

- Application Form
- Project Statement
- Surriculum Vitae or Resume
- Letters of Reference
- Additional components, depending on award
 - Sourse Outlines or Syllabi (for teaching awards)
 - Select Bibliography (for research awards)
 - Language Proficiency Report
 - Letter of Invitation
 - Supplemental materials for applicants in the Arts, Architecture, Writing and Journalism







Project Statement

- Your opportunity to lay out your proposed project specifics in as much detail as possible
- Why Fulbright and why this country/institution/organizations?
- Focus on what you plan to do; the specific courses you plan to teach/the methods and goals of your research
- Outcomes from the grant impact on hosts, home institution and you
- How adaptable are you? How well will you deal with challenging situations?









Affiliations and Invitations

Host Institution:

- If a host is identified, it will be found under Location in the Catalog
- When a host is not identified, there are several resources to help find an affiliation:
 - International office on your campus
 - U.S. and Visiting <u>Fulbright Scholar Directory</u>
 - Review award description for suggested hosts or resources

Letter of Invitation:

- Non-binding expression of interest from proposed host abroad
- Should come from person with whom you will be collaborating
- Should be on host institution letterhead







Submitting a Competitive Application


- Address the Fulbright goal of promoting mutual understanding
- Why you are interested in a Fulbright and why in your proposed host country
- Professional expertise and skills you can offer; benefits to the host institution and host country; exchange of knowledge and experience
- Sultural diplomacy; demonstrated flexibility, adaptability
- Outcomes, impact, and multiplier effect
 - for your professional development, home campus, students, field at large; for your host institution
 - future collaborations; linkages: personal, professional, institutional; plans for sustaining relationships
 - internationalizing campus and curriculum
