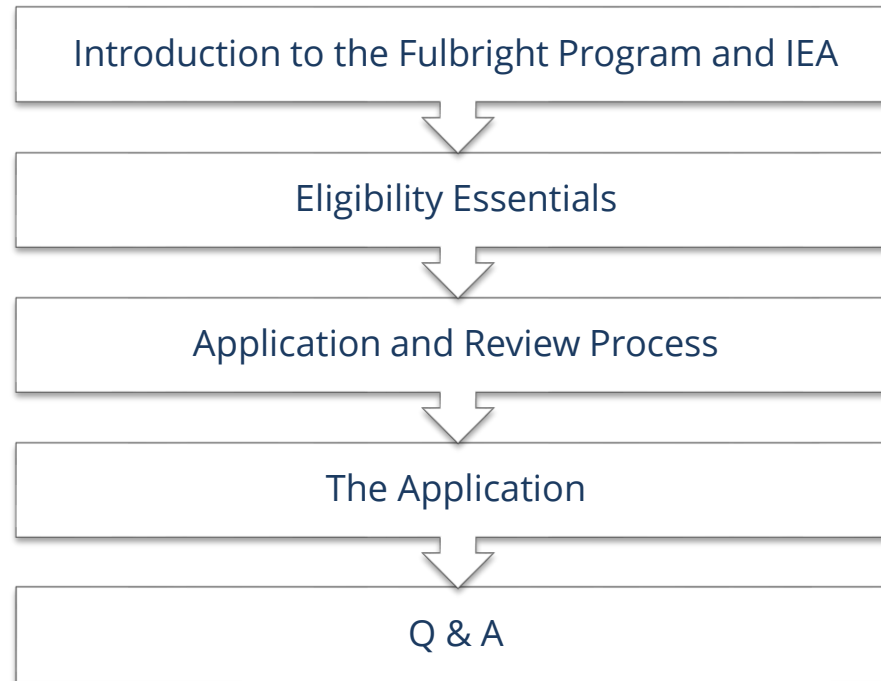

- New policies on previous Fulbright Scholar grants and waiting periods between grants



Program staff conduct technical review for completeness, eligibility

U.S. peer review committee reviews applications

Applicants notified of status following peer review

Recommended applications are sent to host countries and to the J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board

Grantees notified of final approvals

Grant details sent to grantees
