

Senator J. William Fulbright (1905-1995)



"International education exchange is the most significant current project designed to continue the process of humanizing mankind to the point, we would hope, that nations can learn to live in peace."

- Established in 1946
- Sends U.S. academics and professionals overseas and brings scholars and professional from abroad to the U.S.
- Sponsored by U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs
- Administered by the Institute of International Education's Council for International Exchange of Scholars (CIES)

The Fulbright Program



- Established 1946 to expand and strengthen the relationships between the people of the United States and citizens of the rest of the world
- Sponsored by U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs and administered by the Institute of International Education's Council for International Exchange of Scholars (CIES)

Eligibility

- U.S. citizenship
- Degree as required by award
 - > Ph.D. or other terminal degree may be required
 - Many awards in the Core Program are open to applicants with a Masters and professional or academic experience
- Professionals and artists outside academia recognized professional standing and substantial accomplishments
- Teaching experience as required by award
- New policies on previous Fulbright Scholar grants and waiting periods between grants








Core Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program

- Supports teaching and/or research for three to 12 months
- Programs active in +125 countries
- For faculty, administrators and professionals
- Open to all disciplines
- Apply to specific award with proposed project
- Application deadline: August 1
- Variety of host institutions

- Almost 110 awards across a wide variety of Education specializations and TEFL opportunities
- Many awards feature Education or TEFL projects
 - Kosovo: Higher Education
 - Hungary: Education or Psychology
 - Kazakhstan: teaching English as a Foreign Language
 - Mexico: Teaching English as a Second Language
- Many All-Disciplines awards can also support projects in Education
 - Albania: All Disciplines

Education award Highlights

Poland: Distinguished Chair in Humanities and Social Sciences at Adam Mickiewicz University

- Open to academics only
- Teaching, Teaching/Research, or Research
 - Three to nine months
- All teaching will be in English. For research, language proficiency must be commensurate with the project's requirements.
- An invitation letter is required

Finland: Fulbright-Tampere University of Technology Scholar Award

- Open to academics and appropriately qualified professionals
- Teaching/Research
- Three to ten months
- Teaching is in English
- An invitation letter is optional







Discipline Highlights

Algeria: TEFL/Applied Linguistics

- Open to all level of Scholars including early career
- ✓ Teaching
- Length of grant is 10 months
- An invitation letter is preferred

Jordan: teaching English as a Foreign Language

- Open to all level of Scholars including early career
- Teaching
- Six or eight month grants
- Invitation letter is preferred
- ✓ All teaching will be in English
- Special funding for short-term regional travel







Discipline Highlights

Czech Republic: Fulbright-Masaryk Award (NGO Management)

- Teaching/Research or Research
- Three to nine months grant
- Open to all level of Scholars including early career
- Invitation letter is strongly preferred

Argentina: Social Studies and Humanities

- Open to academics and appropriately qualified professionals
- Teaching or Teaching/Research
- Three month grant
- An invitation letter is required







Application Components

- Application Form
- Project Statement
- Curriculum Vitae or Resume
- Letters of Reference
- Additional components, depending on award
 - Sourse Outlines or Syllabi (for teaching awards)
 - Select Bibliography (for research awards)
 - Language Proficiency Report
 - Letter of Invitation
 - Supplemental materials for applicants in the Arts, Architecture, Writing and Journalism







Submitting a Competitive Application

- Fulbright goal: promote mutual understanding
- Why you are interested in a Fulbright and why in your proposed host country
- Professional expertise and skills you can offer; benefits to the host institution and host country; exchange of knowledge and experience
- Cultural diplomacy; demonstrated flexibility, adaptability
- Outcomes, impact, and multiplier effect
 - for your professional development, home campus, students, field at large; for your host institution
 - future collaborations; linkages: personal, professional, institutional; plans for sustaining relationships
 - internationalizing campus and curriculum
