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Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program: Opportunities in the Fine and Performing Arts

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The Fulbright Program



- Established 1946 to expand and strengthen the relationships between the people of the United States and citizens of the rest of the world
- Sponsored by U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs and administered by the Institute of International Education's Council for International Exchange of Scholars (CIES)



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Eligibility for U.S. Scholar Programs

- U.S. citizenship
- Degree as required by award
 - Ph.D. or other terminal degree may be required
 - Many awards are open to applicants with a Masters and professional or academic experience
- Open to professionals and artists outside academia with recognized standing and substantial accomplishments
- Teaching experience as required by award
- New policies on previous Fulbright Scholar grants and waiting periods between grants



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Application Components

- Application Form
- Project Statement
- Curriculum Vitae or Resume
- Letters of Reference
- Additional components, depending on award
 - Course Outlines or Syllabi (for teaching awards)
 - Select Bibliography (for research awards)
 - Language Proficiency Report
 - Letter of Invitation
 - Supplemental materials for applicants in the Arts, Architecture, Writing and Journalism



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Supplemental Materials

- For images, pictures and graphics:
 - Format all images, pictures and graphics into JPEG or BMP files
 - No more than 10 images
- For video and movie clips:
 - Format all movie and video clips into MOV, AVI or MPEG files
- For sound and music clips:
 - Format all sound and music clips into MP3 files
- For writing samples:
 - Format all writing samples in PDF files
 - No more than 15 pages

***ZIP file cannot exceed 500 MB total**



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Letter of Invitation

Host Institution:

- If a host is identified, it will be found under Location in the Catalog
- When a host is not identified, there are several resources to help find an affiliation:
 - International office on your campus
 - U.S. and Visiting [Fulbright Scholar Directory](#)

Letter of Invitation:

- Non-binding expression of interest from proposed host abroad
- Should come from person with whom you will be collaborating
- Should be on host institution letterhead

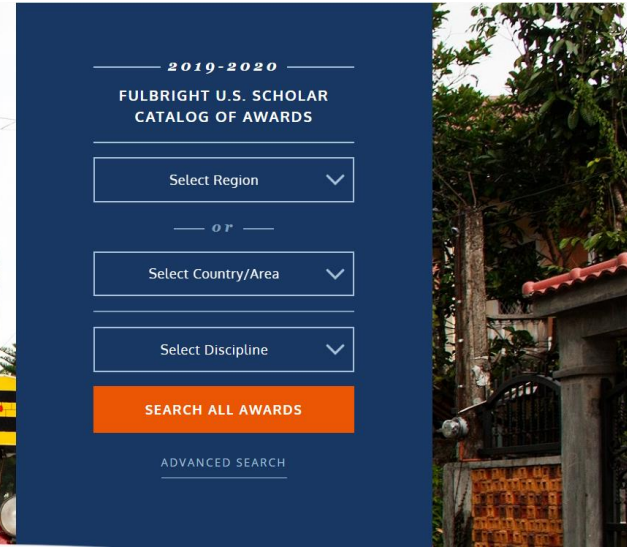

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Sub-Saharan Africa

- Ethiopia: [All Disciplines](#)
 - 10 months
 - Addis Ababa University
 - All teaching will be in English
- Mozambique: [All Disciplines](#)
 - 10 months
 - Fluent Portuguese is required for teaching



Middle East & North Africa

- Egypt: [Visual and Performing Arts](#)
 - 4 months
 - Based in Cairo at Helwan University or Academy of Arts
 - Painting, graphics, sculpture, folklore, visual effects, vocal studies, opera, drama, photography, music (orchestral instruments only), dance (all specializations except for tap dance).

- Jordan: [All Disciplines](#)
 - 5 to 10 months
 - If affiliated w/museum, arts organization, etc. a Ph.D. is not required.



Western Hemisphere

- Canada: [Research Chairs in Arts, Humanities, and Culture](#)
 - Four months. Scholars can seek an unfunded extension for an additional eight months.
 - University of Alberta
- Chile: [Social Sciences, Humanities and Education](#)
 - 3-4 months
 - Working knowledge of Spanish is desired, but not required.



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South & Central Asia

- India: Fulbright-Nehru Academic and Professional Excellence Awards (All Disciplines)

- 4-9 months
- A letter of invitation is optional

- Nepal: All Disciplines (Teaching and Research)

- 5 or 7 months
- Kathmandu University
- Applicants in the arts are required to hold a terminal degree in their field and are expected to have recognized professional standing and substantial professional accomplishments.



East Asia & the Pacific

- Taiwan: Arts, Education, Humanities, Professional Fields and Social Sciences
 - 5 or 10 months
 - Arts & Culture is a priority area
 - All teaching will be in English.
- Australia: Fulbright Distinguished Chair in Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences
 - 5-6 months
 - Australian National University
 - Letter of Invitation required



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Europe & Eurasia

- United Kingdom: [Fulbright-Scotland Visiting Professorship at the Glasgow School of Art](#)

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Submitting a Competitive Application

- Address the Fulbright goal of promoting mutual understanding
- Why you are interested in a Fulbright and why in your proposed host country
- Professional expertise and skills you can offer; benefits to the host institution and host country; exchange of knowledge and experience
- Cultural diplomacy; demonstrated flexibility, adaptability
- Outcomes, impact, and multiplier effect
 - for your professional development, home campus, students, field at large; for your host institution
 - future collaborations; linkages: personal, professional, institutional; plans for sustaining relationships
 - internationalizing campus and curriculum



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Review Process and Timeline

AUG.

Program staff conduct technical reviews for completeness

SEPT.

Discipline-specific committees review applications

**SEPT. -
EARLY NOV.**

U.S. peer review committees discuss applications for a single geographical region

NOV. - JAN.

Applicants notified of status - Recommended applications are sent to host countries and to the J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board

FEB. - MAY

Grantees notified of final approvals

MAY - JUNE

Grant packets sent to grantees
