Fulbright Public Policy Fellowship

- Opportunity to serve as "technical specialists" in a foreign government ministry or institution
 - 80% of time
- Self-directed independent research project
 - 20% of time
- Four to nine months
- Approximately 10 globally (expected at least two per country)













Fulbright Public Policy Fellowship

- U.S. Embassy or Fulbright Commission coordinate placements within host government ministries
- Applicants should not contact potential host ministries to organize or advocate for a placement
- Desired qualifications:
 - Graduate degree in a field applicable to public-policy
 - 3-5 years relevant professional experience
 - Language skills depends on country
 - Motivated, flexible, self-starters









Participating Host Governments

Burma

- Burmese not required
- Fields: Economics, Infrastructure, Public Health, Education, Environmental Science, Communications, Political Science, Agriculture, Economic Development, Energy, Environmental Policy, Women's Issues

Cote D'Ivoire

- Advanced French required
- Potential Hosts: Ministry of Youth, Ministry of Salubrity, Environment, and Sustainable Development, Ministry of Agriculture, Office of the President, Ministry of Interior, Ministry of Foreign Affairs

Peru

- Advanced Spanish required
- Potential Hosts: Ministry of Women and Vulnerable Communities, Ministry of Social Inclusion, and Mesa de Concertación de Lucha contra la Pobreza

Ukraine

- Language skills not required, basic knowledge of Ukrainian or Russian preferred
- Potential Hosts: Ministry of Education, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Temporarily Occupied Territories and IDP
- Fields: Strategic communications and countering disinformation







Application Components

- Application Form
- Project Statement
- Resume
- Letters of Reference
- Select Bibliography
- Language Proficiency Report









Project Statement

- What skills, knowledge, and experience of yours will benefit the host country or institution?
- Tell your story: What led you to apply for this fellowship?
- Outcomes from the grant, impact on host government, your employer, and you
- Mow adaptable are you? How well will you deal with challenging situations?
- What significance does your research project hold for your development and the host country's benefit











Review Process and Timeline

OCT 2018	Application Deadline – Oct. 1 IIE staff conduct technical reviews for completeness
NOV 2018	Peer reviewers discuss applications and make recommendations for further consideration by US Embassies or Fulbright Commission in the host country
DEC 2018	US Embassies or Fulbright Commissions overseas review recommended applications, interview candidates virtually and consult with ministries
JAN 2019	Recommended candidates reviewed by FFSB for approval
MARCH 2019	Placements coordinated within host government ministries Grantees notified of final selections
JUNE 2019	Pre-departure orientation
JULY 2019	Earliest possible start date
MAY 2020	Latest possible start date
