A Brief History

- Established in 1946 by Congress,
 Fulbright is the United States
 government's flagship international
 educational and cultural exchange
 program.
- Fulbright is sponsored by the U.S.
 Department of State with funding provided by the U.S. Government and administered by the Institute of International Education.

Fulbright by the Numbers



The Fulbright Program funds over 8,000 awards annually:

- 900 U.S. scholars and administrators
- 900 visiting scholars
- 2,200 U.S. students
- 4,000 foreign students
- 400+ language teaching assistants

Approximately 400,000 "Fulbrighters" have participated in the program since its inception in 1946.







Eligibility for U.S. Scholar Program



- U.S. citizenship
- Degree and experience, as required by award:
 - Ph.D. or other terminal degree
 - MA and higher education teaching or professional experience
 - Professional and/or artistic experience with substantial accomplishments
 - Teaching experience as required
- Compliance with <u>policies</u> on previous Fulbright
 Scholar awards and waiting periods between grants








Brazil: Overview

- One of the largest offerings in the Scholar Program: 7 awards funding up to 40 recipients, 30 through all discipline awards.
- Research or teaching + research opportunities
- Variety of eligible institutions and partner universities
- Support from the Fulbright Commission in Brazil
- Regional Travel Grant available









Awards

All Disciplines Award (up to 30 recipients)

- 3 to 4 months for research or teaching + research
- Open to artists, professionals and academics at all levels
- Invitation letter required; Commission can be of assistance
- PhD/terminal degree required
- Flex option available for 4 months (2 visits of 2 months each, between July 1, 2023 and September 30, 2024)

Projects are welcome in all parts of Brazil, specifically beyond the urban areas of Rio de Janeiro and São Paulo







Distinguished Scholar Awards (6)

- 3 to 4-month Research awards at various partner universities
- Open to mid-career and senior academics
- Invitation letter should not be sought
- Flex option available for 4 months (2 visits of 2 months each, between July 1, 2023, and September 30, 2024)
- Housing and relocation support may be included







Fulbright Distinguished Scholar Awards, Interdisciplinary Network:

- pre-arranged affiliations to host exceptional scholars who conduct research relevant to any of five Brazilian partner universities.
- conduct their research, work collaboratively with Brazilian colleagues, guest-lecture, mentor students, network, and promote their research while representing the United States, the Fulbright Program, and their home and partner universities
- teaching activities, if any, should not exceed three hours per week

The applicant must select one partner university:

Fulbright Award in Racial Studies at the Universidade Federal da Bahia (UFBA)

Fulbright Award in Law and Political Sciences at the Universidade Federal de Minas Gerais (UFMG)

Fulbright Award in Sustainability at the Universidade Federal do Para (UFPA)

Fulbright Award in Languages and Identities at the Universidade Federal de Santa Catarina (UFSC)

Fulbright Award in International Relations at the Universidade de Brasilia (UnB)

In-Country Benefits

Western Hemisphere Fulbright Regional Travel Grant

- funding to engage in variety of activities in the region such as lectures, seminars, conferences, curriculum development, needs assessment, etc.
- Activities may not include research
- Meant to cover transportation costs.

Application Timeline

Deadline September 15, 2022

- Discipline Review: October through November
- Only Recommended Applications Move Forward
- Final Selections (from Brazil and the Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board) through April 2023
