Why Fulbright?

Fulbright is family-friendly.

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- Approximately 60% of our awards provide dependent support
- Many Fulbright dependents go on to have international careers





Why Fulbright?

Fulbright is supportive.

- 70% of applicants engage with IIE staff
- **Continued support** while in country from IIE and host country staff
- Access to **Fulbright alumni** as a resource





Eligibility for U.S. Scholar Program

🔾 🛛 U.S. citizenship

Degree and experience, as required by award:

- Ph.D. or other terminal degree
- MA and higher education teaching or professional experience
- Professional and/or artistic experience with substantial accomplishments
- Teaching experience as required

Compliance with <u>policies</u> on previous Fulbright Scholar awards: two year waiting period between Fulbright U.S. Scholar award and next application

Flex Option

- Available in 63 countries and all world areas
- Allows multiple visits over two years

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Selecting the Right Award

- **Match** country interest, expertise, career profile, and proposal to the award description
- Language ability (if applicable)
- **Discipline preferences**, when specified
- **Project relevance** to the host country and/or institution
- Benefits to you and your community

Remember: you can only apply for **ONE AWARD** per application cycle

- **14 unique awards offered across 10 countries**, from Bangladesh to Uzbekistan
- **"Flex Option**" for 2-3 visits over two academic years
- Multi-country research through the South and Central Asia Regional Research Award
- **Regional Travel Program**: During your grant, travel to another country in the region to attend a conference, workshop or give a lecture

 - Open to all disciplines
- Fulbright-Kalam Climate Fellowship
 - Open to academics and professionals, Flex available
- Fulbright-Nehru International Education
 Administrators (IEA) Program
 - For university staff, administrators and institutional leadership to learn about India's higher education system. Share with your leadership!
 - DOES NOT support research/teaching

- Research projects in all disciplines in 2-3 countries in the region
- Open to academics of all ranks, PhD not required
- 4-9 months, applicant determines time frame
- Dependent benefits available

Application Components

Requirements:

- Application Form
 - **Project Statement**
- Curriculum Vitae or Resume
- 2 Letters of Recommendation
- Language Proficiency Report (if required)



Supplemental Materials:

- - **Course outlines or syllabi** (for teaching)



Portfolio submissions (for artists, architects, and journalists)



Tips for a strong application:



Before you start, **read your award's description carefully** to ensure you meet all requirements and your proposed project is possible.

The Power

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Start application and enter referees' information **as soon as possible**.



Take advantage of IIE resources, including webinars, office hours and application guidance on our website.



Application Cycle

FEBRUARY	Competition Opens
SEPTEMBER 15	Application Deadline
SEPTEMBER	Program staff conducts technical reviews for completeness
OCTOBER – NOVEMBER	U.S. peer review
NOVEMBER – JANUARY	Applicants notified of status. Recommended applications are sent to host countries and to the Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board.
JANUARY – JUNE	Final decisions are made
JUNE – ONWARD	Participants prepare for departure
