A Brief History

- Established in 1946 by Congress, Fulbright is the United States government's flagship international educational and cultural exchange program.
- Fulbright is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State with funding provided by the U.S. Government and administered by the Institute of International Education.

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Eligibility

fulbrightscholars.org/IEA

- Applicants must meet general eligibility requirements, including U.S. Citizenship
- Affiliation with a two- or four-year college, university or a nonprofit international education exchange organization
- Appropriate level of experience for the award you are pursuing. Check the award requirements tab of the description for specific requirements!
 - In all cases, applicants should be Alumni can apply as long as it's been 2 years since your last grant!
- Can faculty participate?
 - Yes, but **only** if they serve in a capacity as an administrator that includes international responsibility, such as a director, dean or chair

IEA awards do not support research or teaching.
