- Additional requirements vary by award
- New policies on previous Fulbright Scholar grants and waiting periods between grants

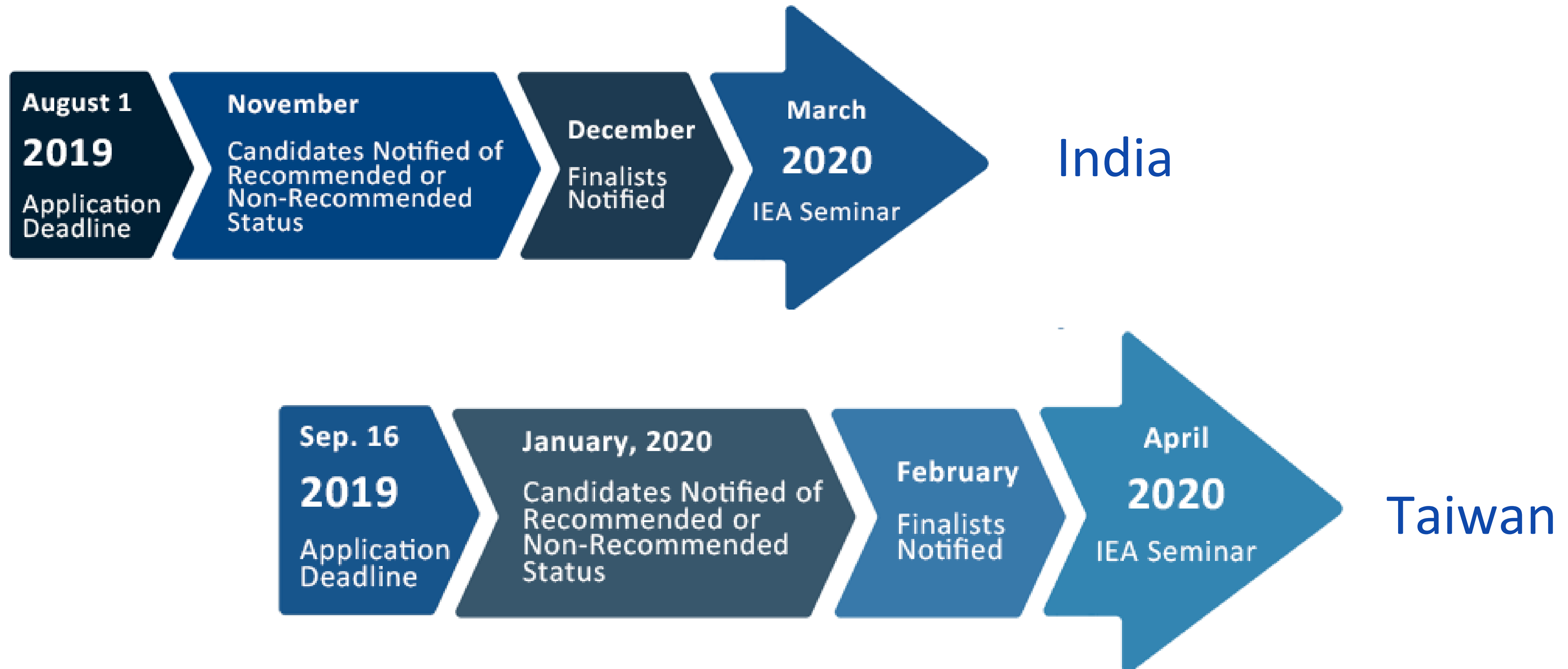
- Your current job responsibilities and how they relate to this grant.

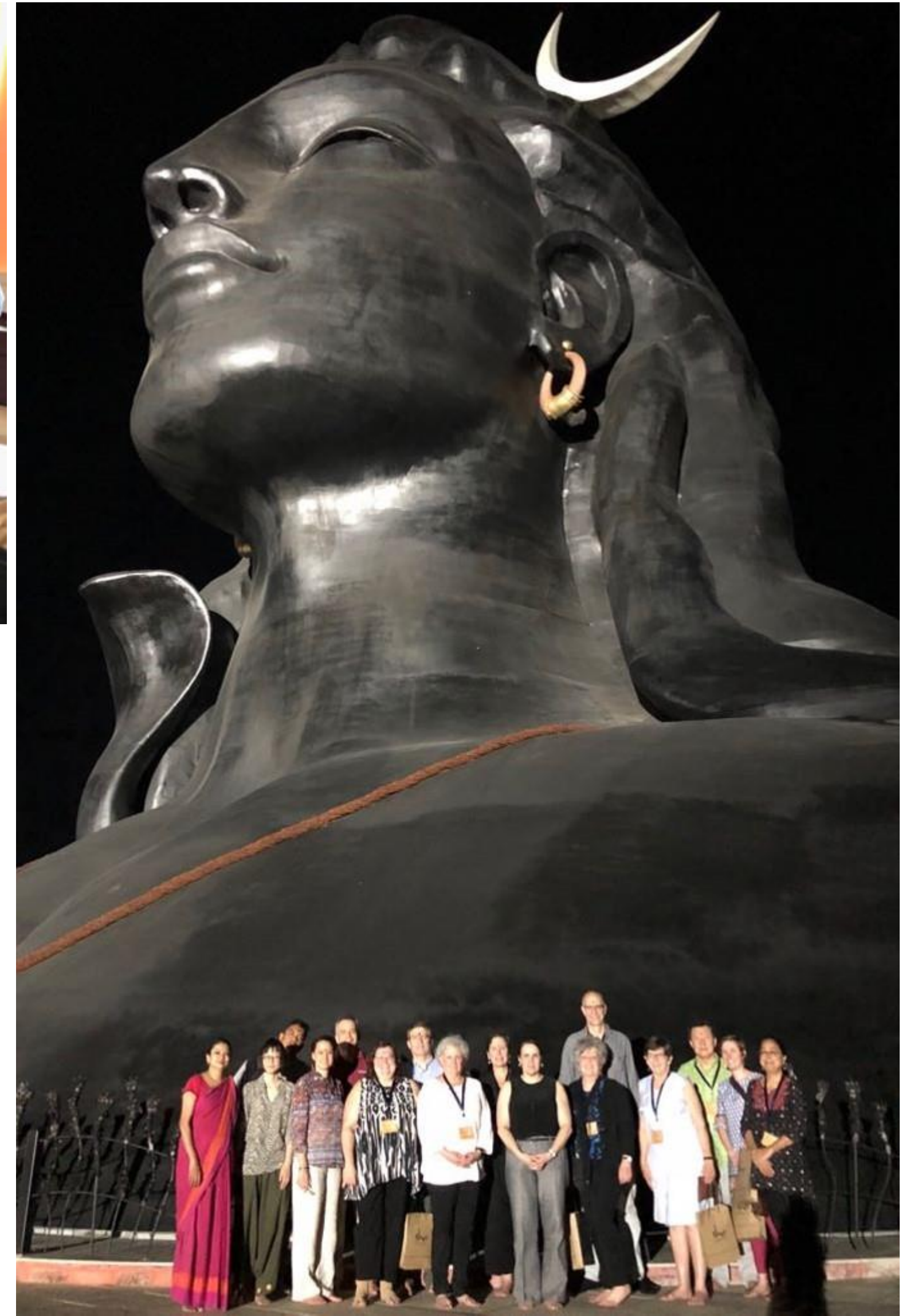
