Institutions Served by Fulbright OLF

The focus of the OLF is to engage with institutions that are underrepresented within the Fulbright program. These include;

- Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander Serving Institutions (AANAPISIs) \mathbf{C}
- Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs) \mathbf{C}
- Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) \mathbf{C}
- Predominantly Black Institutions (PBIs) \mathbf{C}
- \mathbf{C} **Community Colleges**
- **Small Liberal Arts Colleges** \mathbf{C}

- Enables Fulbright Visiting Scholars who are currently in the United States to \mathbf{C} accept guest lecturing invitations at other U.S. colleges and universities

- Access to leading scholars from around the world.














Benefits for Fulbright Visiting Scholars







- Unique opportunity for visiting scholars to experience different areas of the **United States**
- Opportunity for visiting scholars to share their Fulbright projects and culture with new audiences
- Expansions of scholar's network with faculty and administrators of another U.S. institution and various organizations in the area where they present







Eligibility Requirements

The Host Institutions must:

- \mathbf{C} Be an accredited U.S. college or university
- Be located at least 75 miles away from the scholar's U.S. host institution
- Cover lodging, local transportation, meals, and incidentals*
- Supplemental Funding may be available upon request
- **The Fulbright Visiting Scholar must:**
 - Be a current Fulbright Visiting Scholar grantee in the United States
 - Be on a Fulbright Grant longer than three months
 - Possess a U.S. Social Security Number and a U.S. bank account















A Cost Share Program

Funds Provided through Fulbright:

- Airfare
- Transportation to and from the airport

- guest lecture to students and/or faculty
- 3. <u>Apply</u> for OLF travel award funding after you and the scholar have solidified details regarding the lecture

- Produce and upload a letter of invitation to lecture at a U.S. college and university. <u>Checklist online.</u>
- Upload letter from the Scholar's Faculty Associate (at the primary hosting institution) Template <u>here</u>.
- Ensure that the lecture does not take place within the last month of the scholar's grant period and is between 2-6 days in length
- Submit online application at least 30 days in advance of the proposed OLF visit
- Once the scholar receives the approval email from IIE, they can then purchase their ticket or arrange other transportation for the trip

Please allow at least 1 week for us to respond to your application.

What Should an Invitation Letter Say?

- Purpose(s) of the visit at the OLF host institution
- Type of activities the scholar will engage in the dates of the visit
- Commitment from the host institution to provide housing, meals, and local transportation \mathbf{C}
- Honorarium amount, if offered (not required) \mathbf{C}
- Suggested collaboration with another neighboring institution, especially other priority institutions such as:
 - Minority Serving Institutions (MSIs)
 - Community Colleges (SS)
 - Small Liberal Arts Institutions (LAC)
 - Geographically underrepresented Institutions
- Online checklist
