A Brief History

- Established in 1946 by Congress, Fulbright is the United States government's flagship international educational and cultural exchange program.
- Fulbright is sponsored by the U.S.
 Department of State with funding provided by the U.S. Government and administered by the Institute of International Education.







Diversity and Inclusion

Fulbright strives to ensure that it reflects the diversity of U.S. society and societies abroad. We encourage the involvement of people from traditionally underrepresented audiences in all our grants, programs and other initiatives.

Opportunities are open to people regardless of their race, color, national origin, sex, age, religion, geographic location, socioeconomic status, disability, sexual orientation or gender identity.









Fulbright by the Numbers

The Fulbright Program funds over 8,000 awards annually:

- 2,200 U.S. Students
- 4,000 foreign students
- 800 U.S. scholars and administrators
- 900 visiting scholars
- 400+ language teaching assistants

Approximately 390,000 "Fulbrighters" have participated in the program since its inception in 1946.










Distribution of Awards

Fulbright awards allow academics and professionals to participate in a wide variety of activities:

- Postdoctoral research (8%)
- Administrator seminar (9%)
- Teaching (17%)
- Research (28%)
- Teaching/Research (38%)









Eligibility for U.S. Scholar Program



- U.S. citizenship
- Degree and experience, as required by award:
 - Ph.D. or other terminal degree
 - MA and higher education teaching or professional experience
 - Professional and/or artistic experience with substantial accomplishments
 - Teaching experience
- Compliance with <u>policies</u> on previous Fulbright Scholar awards and waiting periods between grants







Program Highlights

- February 3, 2020: Competition opened with new Catalog of Awards
- September 15, 2020: Application deadline
- New: Only 2 letters of recommendation required
- IEA Seminar: Statement of Intent replaced with question boxes
- Fulbright Arctic Initiative: Collaborative research award for Arctic Circle member countries (NOTE: May deadline)
- Fulbright Public Policy Fellowship: Early career professionals, placements available in government ministries in 4 countries (Burma, Cote d'Ivoire, Peru, Ukraine)

South & Central Asia

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India: All Disciplines Award is now open to professional projects in addition to teaching and research, 45 grants available

Maldives: 2 grants: teach at Maldivian National University or professional project at gov't. ministry

Sri Lanka: Up to 3 grants for 3 to 9 months. Open to all disciplines.

Central Asia: Teaching English as a Foreign Language Teach in one of the following countries: Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, or Uzbekistan. Two grants available.

Regional Travel Program: Allows grantee to travel to another country in the region to attend a conference, workshop or give a lecture (no research).







Sub-Saharan Africa

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Focus on teaching and capacity building, hence longer award duration

Western Hemisphere

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Brazil: Distinguished Chair awards in IR, legal theory, public policy, neuroscience and U.S. studies

Canada: several research chair awards in 12 disciplines at several universities; 45 grants available

Colombia: Distinguished Chair in Biodiversity and Sustainable Development at Universidad Nacional de

Colombia

Mexico: TEFL award, U.S. Studies Chair, Post-doc, Border Scholars Award

Uruguay: Agriculture

Carlos Rico Award in North American Studies (Canada-Mexico): engage in collaborative research with equal time spent in both countries

Regional Travel Program: Allows grantees to travel to another country to attend a conference, workshop or give a lecture (no research).







Multi-country Opportunities

Fulbright Arctic Initiative: Collaborative research undertaken by scholars from Canada, Denmark,

Finland, Iceland, Norway, Russia, and Sweden and the U.S.

Deadline is in May.

Global Scholar Award: Allows researchers to propose projects in 2-3 countries in 2-3 world regions.

Most competitive award in the catalog. Applicants advised to apply for single

country award if their project closely aligns with one country.

Regional Awards: ASEAN Research, Cross-Strait Studies, EU-Schuman, Africa Regional

Research, SCA Regional Research, MENA Regional Research, Carlos-Rico,

Morocco-Spain Joint Teaching Award, Spain-Greece Joint Teaching/Research

Application Cycle

FEBRUARY	Awards Catalog Opens
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SEPTEMBER 15 Application Deadline

SEPTEMBER Program staff conducts technical reviews for completeness

OCTOBER – NOVEMBER U.S. peer review

NOVEMBER – JANUARY Applicants notified of status. Recommended applications are sent to host countries and to the J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board.

JANUARY – APRIL Grantees are notified of final approvals

MAY – ONWARD Grantees prepare for grants





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
